Trinity Students Visit Thread Together



Did you know that on average, 10 boxes of Thread Together stock has a retail value in excess of \$21,000?

On Wednesday 3 April, students from Trinity College in Gawler assisted Thread Together with unpacking 30 boxes of stock and preparing the van for site visits. The students were blown away by the value and quality of garments that Thread Together distributes to those in need, and learned about waste within the apparel industry.

“These clothes are actually cool, why throw them away? I’d totally wear these clothes” said Dylan, Year 6 student whilst unpacking the boxes.

We spoke to the students about how we feel when we wear something new for the first time and how important the program is for restoring confidence and dignity.

“Thread Together is not only good for the community, but the planet too. It doesn’t make sense for this to go to waste” said Bailey, Year 7.

2019 Rental Affordability Snapshot

The results from the Rental Affordability Snapshot were released last month with sadly more bad news for South Australians, with a little over 3% of properties listed being affordable for households on income support.

The snapshot surveyed rental properties available in the Adelaide area on Saturday, 23 March 2019. Properties were assessed for affordability and appropriateness for a number of different household types and incomes. This survey defined an affordable rental as one which took up less than 30% of the household's income, a common indicator of 'housing stress'.

As an organisation we are actively planning to help with this housing crisis, with one measure being to increase the number of affordable and community houses.

Network Meeting in Brisbane

The Anglicare Australia Chaplaincy and Parish Community Work Network met in Brisbane on 15 - 17 April with five members of the Mission and Anglican Community Engagement Team participating.

The focus of the network gathering was on 'Encouraging Inclusive Communities' and focused on the theology and practice of inclusion and diversity in areas such as disability and homelessness as well as pastoral care through parish engagement.

The network gathering was held in the precinct of St John's Cathedral Brisbane with times of prayer and reflection held in the Cathedral where there is also a significant engagement with rough sleepers in the city through a local Deacon who is also a Medical Practitioner.

Participants of the network appreciated this opportunity for professional development in a specific area of the life of Anglicare organisations across Australia with every State and Territory represented excepting Tasmania and the ACT.
